F.V. husband and wife receive volunteer awards

Carla Cammack of Fountain Valley received the Komen Warrior Award in November for her work with the Orange County affiliate of Susan G. Komen for the Cure. Cammack, who is a 13-year breast cancer survivor, participated in her first Komen Orange County Race for the Cure as a chemotherapy patient in 1997. Since then she has become an avid volunteer, leading the way as the 2007 and 2008 Race chair and serving on the board of directors.

Robert Cammack, Carla's husband, received the organization's Volunteer of the Year award the same night. He has been a strong supporter and volunteer since Carla was diagnosed with breast cancer in 1997. As 2010 Race for the Cure pledge co-captain and T-shirt captain, he has shown an unwavering commitment

to helping the Komen Orange County Affiliate end breast cancer forever.

Beyond the Race for the Cure, which raised \$3 million in September, volunteers also assist the Komen Orange County Affiliate in a variety of functions, including serving on the annual Pink Tie Ball and Breast Health Symposium committees, providing administrative office support and helping with third party events.

"The passionate volunteers who dedicate their time and energy toward the fight against breast cancer continue to inspire me every day," said Cindy Brenneman, director of volunteer services for the Komen Orange County Affiliate. "Their tireless commitment makes them heroes not only to the organization but to the many women living with breast cancer whose lives they impact."
