Three local men were among seven businessmen chosen by the Orange County Affiliate of Susan G. Komen for the Cure to serve as the newest class of Pink Tie Guys at this year's Pink Tie Ball. Pink Tie Guy is a title given annually to men who will advocate for the organization's breast health mission within the community.

Among this year's Pink Tie Guys are:
