President Abe Lincoln will be in the building at 7:30 p.m. April 20 at the Tustin Area Historical Society's meeting at the Tustin Area Senior Center Lounge, 200 South C St. Dr. Ronald Rietveld, professor of history at Cal State Fullerton and adviser to the Abraham Lincoln Bicentennial Commission, will talk about his discovery of the last photograph known to exist of Abraham Lincoln. It was taken at his 1865 funeral in New York. It's a photo that never was released to the public and was thought to have

been intentionally destroyed. This year marks the 200th anniversary of Lincoln's birth.
